Definition

- Limited Submissions occur when sponsoring agencies restrict the number of applications allowed per institution.
- Language restricting the number of applications is often found in the RFA's Eligibility section. For example:
 - "An institution may submit only 1 new or resubmission application under this RFA during this funding cycle"

The Executive Vice President & Chief Academic Officer (EVP8CAO) has instituted the following Limited Submission pre-application process for such programs.
Faculty Resources Student Services Financial Management Limited Submissions + Observers, Trainees &	 Investigators interested in any of the programs noted below must submit a pre-application packet to <u>Deanne Hernande</u>; by the specified internal deadline. If the number of interested investigators exceeds allowable proposals, an internal committee comprised appointed by the EVP&CAO will review the pre-applications and recommend the best qualified applicant(s). The EVP&CAO will communicate results of the selection process to both the investigators and Sponsored Projects Administration. Selected investigators are then responsible for submitting a full proposal to the sponsor by the program
Visiting Scientists Conflict of Interest Investigator Briefing in the Responsible	deadline. Please note that we make every effort to identify and post limited submission competitions on this web site as they become available. If you become aware of an limited opportunity that is not listed below, please send an email to Deanne Hernandez with the pertinent information.
Conduct of Research	 'NOTE' If a faculty member identifies a funding opportunity for which UTHealth is only allowed a limited number of applications, he/she should contact <u>Deanne Hermander</u> as soon as possible (713-500-3192). If ARA is contacted two months or more <i>in advance</i> of the agency's submission deadline, an internal competition will be announced on this page (<u>http://www.uh.edu/evpara/funding.htm</u>) and held as noted above to select the UTHealth nominee(s).



Getting the Word Out

- At the point when the office becomes aware of a limited submission opportunity and need for an internal competition, staff will:
 - Send an email announcement on behalf of Dr. Blackburn (EVP/CAO) to the school-based Associate Deans for Research for dissemination to their faculty. The email will provide information on both the opportunity and the internal competition;
 - Publish the announcement and link to the RFA in InsideUTHealth; and
 - Post the internal competition details at <u>http://www.uth.edu/evpara/funding.htm</u>

Internal Competition: Preapps

- There is a prescribed format for preapplications. Elements include:
 - a completed pre-application cover page/template (available on the limited submissions site);
 - a current CV or NIH biosketch; and
 - a brief description (3 page max) of the proposed research that includes an explicit description of the significance, innovation, and potential impact of the proposed work in the field of study.

Internal Competition: Committee Composition

If the number of pre-applicants exceeds allowable slots, Dr. Blackburn will convene a review committee (*if not, applicants are selected on a first-come, first-served basis*).

The composition of the committee will vary based on the specifics of the RFA and the pool of pre-applicants.

Internal Competition: Committee Composition

If the RFP receives broad interest across the university, Dr. Blackburn will solicit senior research faculty to assist in the review.

If the RFP focuses on a specific discipline (i.e., Neuroscience), Dr. Blackburn will ask the pertinent school to coordinate the review.

Internal Competition: Review and Notification

University-wide reviewers will assign an impact score for each preapplication using the NIH 0-9 scale.

Scoring mechanisms for schoolbased reviews are at the discretion of school leadership.

Internal Competition: Review and Notification

- EVP/CAO will communicate internal competition results via email to each pre-applicant.
 - Tailored emails will inform the preapplicant if he or she was selected to apply.
 - SPA will also receive this notification.

Internal Competition: Identifying Opportunities

While we do our best to identify and post limited submission opportunities, we may miss a few.

 If an investigator or pre-award specialist identifies a limited opportunity that is not posted or otherwise communicated, s/he should contact <u>Deanne Hernandez</u> at 713.500.3192 as quickly as possible.

Internal Competition: Identifying Opportunities

- If the EVP/CAO is contacted two months or more *in advance of* the agency's submission deadline, an internal competition will commence and be posted at <u>https://www.uth.edu/evpara/funding.htm</u>.
- If the EVP/CAO is contacted less than two months before the agency's application deadline the UTHealth nominee(s) will be selected on a first come, first served basis, *i.e.*, the first faculty member to inquire will be the UTHealth nominee.
